|  | Find 5 or more waterproof containers around your home such as a water bottle, pan, drinking glass, vase, empty jam jar, etc. Estimate how much water they will hold. Then fill each container up and pour it into a measuring jug to check. Look carefully at the scale used and ask an adult to check. | Monday $18^{\text {th }}$ May is International Museum Day. Many museums and art galleries have virtual tours you can take part in online including the British Museum. Take a long around, who knows what you will discover? | Collect clean tin cans from your recycling bin and create your own tincan alley game. <br> Simply set the cans up and decide on a suitable throwing distance. Throw three bean bags (or pairs of socks) at the cans trying to knock as many down as possible. Make a record of the total score of all three throws - 10 points for knocking all the cans over. <br> The player with the highest score wins! |
| Go on an alphabet scavenger hunt. Can you find an object that starts with every letter of the alphabet? | Create your own times tables board game including 2, 3, $4,5,8$ and 10 times tables. You may have to answer the question you land on and pick up special challenge cards - you make the rules! | Have a go at Graffiti artwork. With permission, Graffiti your fence/well with uplifting messages or bright artwork in chalk. | May is National Walk Month, go on a walk with your family. Talk to one another and enjoy the sights around you. How far can you walk? |
| Write a conversation between two, or more, characters using punctuation correctly. Can you use a range of synonyms for said? | Shape hunt - go on a shape hunt around the house, what different shapes can you find? | Transform an empty shoebox into a setting from one of your favourite storybooks - can you family guess what story it is? | Play a board game together - maybe you can play your times tables board game. |
| Draw your own spring scene and write a short description of what you can see. Use a preposition in every sentence. | Put the following numbers into ascending order: $240,70,29,587,120,58,378,93$, <br> Then find 10 more and 10 less than each number. | Pick an exercise move for each number on a dice, i.e 1 may be running on the spot for 1 minute, 6 might be 6 star jumps, etc. <br> Take turns rolling the dice for some movement fun! | Dig out old photographs and talk to each other about what they show. Think about how much you've changed, how fashions have changed, share lovely memories together and if you have really old photographs you might want to try and find out more about your family's history. |
| Write instructions for how to grow a plant. Think carefully about the subheadings you will need to use and what imperative verbs you might include. | Work out how many days since schools closed (March $20^{\text {th }}$. <br> You will need to know how many days are in the months March and April. Look at a calendar or diary and find out how many days there are in the whole year and how many in each month. What about a leap year? | Sunday $24^{\text {th }}$ May marks the start of Eid ul-Fitr which is a Muslim holiday. <br> Look online to find out more about this holiday and create a fact file explaining all about it and how it is celebrated. | 'Go camping' for a night. You could do this in the garden (if you're lucky enough to own a tent) or in your living room/dining room - make a den and take lots of pillows. Tell stories to each and sing some songs whilst enjoying a hot chocolate. Don't forget to take your torch - can you make animal shapes in the light? |
