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| <p>Our high-quality art curriculum enables children to express themselves creatively through exploration. It will introduce children to a wide range of artists to develop their knowledge of styles and vocabulary.</p> <p>We will encourage and foster:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Providing children with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. • Access to a wide range of inspirational artists who contribute to our culture, including local art and art from around the world. • An awareness of how art and design reflects and shapes our history. • Challenging children to think critically and develop a rigorous understanding of art and design. | <p>Art in the Early Years Within our Early Years Curriculum children are taught to represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music and dance. They safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.</p> <p>Key Stage 1 and 2. Children are taught through three units per year. Each unit of learning starts with researching an artist, exploring ideas and then recording experiences using their imagination. Children practice various techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space using high quality resources in their Art Journals. Using these skills, children create their own works of art before critically evaluating these.</p> <p>Each unit builds upon previous learning so that children become proficient in drawing, painting, collage, printing, textiles and sculpture skills.
